Ideas for Learner-generated Texts	
Item	Description
Shared experience	Students develop a text based on a novel or exciting experience they shared.
Students' newsletters	Students share their good and bad news with the class, which is collated into a newsletter, post or website by the instructor or tech-savvy student.
Picture stories	Learners view a series of pictures, then dictate the story of what they see happening and the instructor transcribes.
Responding to a photograph or visual	Students write a caption or a comment to a picture or photo.
Transcribed recorded conversations	Short conversations that have been recorded can be transcribed verbatim or for the gist.
Journal entries	Students can write public or private short texts on assigned or self-generated topics.
Texts from wordless books	Students can create text to accompany books without words.
Photo books	Students make storybooks out of photos they take themselves, find on the Internet, or in magazines, newspapers, etc. They can narrate these stories orally or in writing.
Class posters	Students create posters about themselves, their families, or any topic of interest with pictures and text.
Overheard student stories	Students write stories they overhear from strangers on the bus, in the supermarket, etc.
