| Materials | Picture Dictionaries or copy of fake check from Internet (www.horseclicks.com/images/ 11 k -check.jpg) <br> Blank check: <br> (http://away2paytaxes.com/pics/blankcheck account.jpg) <br> Actual U.S coins and dollar bills, Coins and bills from foreign countries(students will bring their home currency), Match the numbers worksheet |
| Activities | Look at the coins and dollar bills and compare them with foreign currency. Identify the similarities and differences in coin and currency denominations. Practice pronouncing the names of American money (penny, nickel, dime, quarter, half dollar and dollar). Teacher direct discussion: each student talks about his/her home currency. <br> Look at the fake check and identify the parts of a check paying special attention to words like pay to, date, and signature. Using blank check from Internet or picture dictionary fill out a fake check. Write numbers as words to improve check writing skills. |
| Assessment/ Evidence | Currency discussions showed evidence of listening and speaking skills. Check writing activity provided practice for reading and writing words and simple sentences. <br> Follow up: Write a check to pay an actual bill. <br> Write numbers as words correctly. |
| Reflection | Very interesting discussion about coins and symbols on coins. Some students were surprised when they realized that not every country has different names for coins and currencies. Fake check was a good resource to practice writing a check. Some students needed extra copies to |
