Assessment/ Evidence	Calendar-Familiarize with school report card and grading scales to have meaningful communication with teachers during fall/spring parent-teacher conference. Write questions about grades on the writing board. Discuss the report card vocabulary. Explain the grading scales and the symbols. Encourage students to talk about grades and parent teacher meeting from their home country. Help students compare American grading scales to their own to gain better understanding of our system. Role play as parent and teacher using vocabulary words and phrases from the grade card. Practice reading and pronunciation of vocabulary and phrases. Finish work sheet and word search. Follow up: practice reading the word and phrases and write simple questions/concerns about their children's report card to be prepared to talk to the teacher during parent-teacher conference  Discussion, reading and writing to check understanding and the ability to have a successful
	conference with teachers.
Reflection	This lesson is planned and taught because of multiple requests from our students who have children in elementary/intermediate grades in local schools. They expressed their difficulty in communicating with teachers due to their inability to understand what grade cards represent in terms of their child's learning. Students agreed to share their experience in class after they meet with their children's school teachers. A few of them are planning to formulate some questions using report card to talk during conference. They talked about being less nervous as they were able to get some understanding of the report card.
