Activities	Visit the local waste management website (We used Hancock County Solid Waste Management <u>www.hancockenvironment.com/recycling.htm</u>) for information on "Why recycle." Gather information about individual knowledge and opinion about recycling. Students share with class their recycling practices. Help those who do not recycle, understand the importance of recycling. Read and discuss the website information about the materials which can be recycled and the various drop-off locations in town. Practice pronunciation of new vocabulary. Use dictionary to find out the meaning of new words. Complete the hand out.
Assessment/ Evidence	Using the vocabulary and the new information write five reasons to answer the question" Why recycle"?
Reflection	Was this lesson difficult for low level students? It was interesting to hear the opinions for and against recycling. Those who were against didn't know the energy and environmental problems resulting from too much garbage.

What is recycling?

Recycling is collecting and turning used materials such as paper, plastic, aluminum, glass, and cardboard into new products by re-processing and re-manufacturing instead of throwing them away as garbage or trash.

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Vocabulary

Recycle: To change trash into usable products.

Process: A series of changes taking place in a definite manner.

Manufacture: To make or produce

Energy: Any source of usable power such as gasoline, or electricity.

Save: Avoid spending or wasting.

Conserve: To use wisely.

Preserve: To keep safe from harm, protect.

Resource: A source of supply


Reduce: To bring down


Environment: Everything that surrounds us; air, water, soil
