Materials	<p>Warning labels from common household cleaning supplies. (bring in from home or Internet)</p> <p>List of common household cleaning products (Use http://cleaning-supplies.gillroys.com).</p> <p>Picture signs and symbols (can be printed out from http://chemistry.about.com/od/safetysignsandsymbols/Safety_Signs_and_Symbols.htm). This site has about 93 index card sized pictures of warning signs. Instructors can print out the cards in color and laminate them for repeat use. We created a set of cards and vocabularies for students to play match the words with pictures.</p> <p>Handout attached and Dictionaries.</p>

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Activities	Tape the picture signs and symbols on the board. Have students identify them. Pass out the warning labels and help students read them. Discuss the warnings and understand the vocabulary. Students in pairs/ groups read labels independently. Practice pronunciation. Identify the picture warning signs. Match the pictures and vocabulary. Discuss and list/write safety measures to take at home and work.
Assessment/ Evidence	Ability to classify/group common household products based on the warning. Comprehension of both written and picture warnings. Ability to read and pronounce new vocabulary.
Reflection	Working students were able to talk about the safety requirements at work. Had good discussion and was able to make a plan to keep household products with warnings away from children. Low level students might need more practice with vocabulary. Using both picture and word warnings helped, but need more practice to follow written warnings.
