Activities	<ol> <li>Open a discussion about recycling by asking:         <ul> <li>if anyone recycles</li> <li>why they recycle</li> <li>how long they've been recycling</li> <li>why people might not recycle</li> <li>where recycling locations are</li> </ul> </li> <li>Bring an assortment of items some of which are recyclable. Spread the items out on a table and ask</li> </ol>

(recycling number 1-7).3. Based on Ss responses, clarify any misinformation

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	<ul> <li>they might have by passing out a brochure on recycling or by visiting a local recycling website (i.e. timetorecycle.org)</li> <li>4. Next talk about reuse rather than recycling. Go to: allfreecrafts.com and scroll down to the bottom to "recycling crafts". Have Ss explore the website for ideas then choose a craft that Ss might enjoy doing and pull up the directions. I chose to make bows out of used wrapping paper.</li> <li>5. You or your students can bring in the necessary supplies for the craft and create it in class by reading.</li> </ul>
	supplies for the craft and create it in class by reading the step by step directions.  6. As a final recycling activity, plan a field trip to a local recycling center. Encourage Ss to ask questions and to implement recycling in their homes.
Assessment/ Evidence	Ss will create a craft from used materials and/or begin home recycling if they don't currently recycle.
Reflection	The field trip to a local recycling center made a deep impression on the students. They couldn't believe how much trash/recyclables people throw away.
