| Activities | Students fill in the K column of their KWL worksheet with the <br> name(s )of US presidents that they know. Students then add <br> information about the president(s) as best they can. <br> Students write two things they would like to know about the <br> presidents in the W column. <br> Students get together into 4 groups and <br> share their information with the students in their group. <br> Students then share their information with the class and the <br> teacher writes the information on the board for all to see. <br> Students use the citizenship questions to come up with 3 facts <br> about the president. Students write the facts on a piece of paper. <br> Students' fact sheets will be displayed on the bulletin board. <br> Students review the Citizenship questions relating to the |
