| Activities | Begin by discussing with the class what a volunteer is. <br> Have students use the dictionary and find and write the definition down of what a volunteer is. <br> Students and teachers write a list of where they may think good places are to volunteer. <br> Teacher show a local website where students can find local opportunities to volunteer their time. Find the perfect volunteer opportunity" located in the middle column near the bottom of the page. <br> Read and discuss some of the possible places they could volunteer from the site. <br> Teacher and students can discuss any times that they have volunteered before and the pros and cons to volunteering for an organization. <br> Teacher plans a volunteer from a local agency to come to class the following week. |
