List-Group-Label

Purpose:

To engage an entire class in a "risk-free" task that allows all to examine prior knowledge about a topic. This activity also allows a teacher to help dispel misconceptions students may have on a topic. This is a good prereading activity.

Procedure:

- 1. Introduce a key term or topic and encourage the students to come up with related words.
- 2. Write all brainstormed ideas on the board. Avoid questioning the validity of any of the responses.
- 3. After 25+ words have been written on the board, engage students in examining their responses. Ask the entire class the relevance of words that do not seem to have a direct connection to the topic. Allow students to change and refine their suggestions. This is the time to dispel any misconceptions the students may have about the topic
- 4. Now ask students to group the words into semantic categories, encouraging them to subdivide large groupings. Suggest the idea of a "misfit" category for words that do not seem to have a connection to any other words.
- 5. Have students create a label for each group.
